This graph shows how much income (money) and expenses (money) a charity has had each year over the past few years. Charities have many sources of income, including donations, government grants, and services for sale to the general public. Similarly, expenses are all that allow charities to operate, from staff payments to rents. First of all, this graph shows the size of a charity, from small (budgets of less than 100,000 dollars) to huge ones (budgets of more than 100 million dollars). We are also looking for variability - if charity revenue and expenses are going up and down year by year, make sure you have good reason. Unlike companies, charities and nonprofits don't have a mission to make money. But if they spend more than they receive, they will eventually get into trouble with too much debt. As a general rule, make it possible for revenue to slightly exceed expenses. If the expenses certainly exceed revenue, the charity is losing money. If your revenue is much larger than your expenses, your charity may not be using that resource effectively. But it's not always that simple, and there are many reasons why charities don't follow this pattern. They may have saved up for a big purchase or campaign, or they might have paid for a big one-off. If you're worried, always look at your annual and financial reports to understand why charities are making decisions.
